# Outside chance of promotion

**T**HE Bournemouth club did not adopt its present title—Bournemouth and Boscombe Athletic—until 33 years after its inception in 1890. Professionals were employed even before the first war, however, and in 1923 Bournemouth, then a Southern League club, were admitted to the Third Division (South) when a vacancy occurred.

The Cherries have always been in the Third Division, and their most spectacular contribution to soccer history was six winters ago when they beat both Wolves and Spurs in the Cup before going out to Manchester United in front of a record 28,799 attendance at Dean Court.

The arrival of Bill McGarry, the former England wing-half from Huddersfield, in 1961, boosted the fortunes of the club, and in the last couple of seasons Bournemouth have been strong challengers for promotion to the Second Division.

McGarry went to Watford last summer, but the man who succeeded him, Reg Flewin, once of Portsmouth fame and previously manager of Stockport County, is sufficiently versed in football management to have carried on the good work, and at this stage Bournemouth still have a fair chance of winning that coveted Division Two ticket.

## Goalkeepers

**David Best** — One of the most promising youngsters in the country and tipped for international honours. Just out of his teens, this tall, confident custodian has been watched by countless top clubs, having succeeded former Eire cap Tommy Godwin. Played in all 46 games last season.

**Mike O'Hara** — Another youngster, born in County Down. Has already had League experience with Luton Town and Swindon, and is widely regarded as a player whose ability should aid his future progress. Ten outings for Swindon last season.

## Full-backs

**Brian Farmer** — Hails from Stourbridge and spent eight years with Birmingham City before moving to the South Coast two years ago this month. A sound and dependable performer, he had 43 League outings last season. Is also a lay preacher.

**Peter Gledstone** — Recently recovered from a cartilage operation. Born at Ferndown, he signed for Bournemouth in 1956 and had made steady progress. Had nine senior games last winter and wanted a move in the autumn of last year, but was persuaded to stay.

**John Brown** — A local part-time professional, whose senior oppor-

tunities have been hard to come by. Is a steady defender who can be relied upon to deputise more than adequately if so required.

**Roy Parsons** — Is a Merseysider who took the professional plunge with Boscombe. Tall, powerfully built performer who has yet to make his first team debut.

**Tom Strandley** — Equally useful at half-back or full-back. Joined Queen's Park Rangers from Basildon, and had 18 months at Shepherd's Bush before moving to Dean Court just over five years ago. Made 21 senior appearances last season.

## Half-backs

**Ron Bolton** — Another tall lad and a stylish wing-half who used to operate at inside-forward before making his mark in the league side, where he had 39 games last term. A number of clubs in the First Division have noted his ability.

**Roy Gater** — Former manager Bill McGarry went back to his old club, Port Vale, to sign this wing-half, who has shown his worth in the Third Division on a number of occasions. Had 28 first-team outings last season, which

**Bobby Saunders** — Fair-haired right-winger from local football. He has the ability to make his presence felt in the league side, although as yet chances are proving hard to come by.

**Jimmy Singer** — Scored many fine goals for Newport County and Birmingham City noted his progress. Never quite made the First Division grade, although Boscombe are happy with his performances. Last season he top-scored with 12 goals in 34 matches.

**Chris Weller** — Born at Reading, this utility forward has been in and out of the league side, making only five appearances last winter, still a useful man to call upon.

**Charlie Woods** — Signed from Newcastle United last season for £7,000 and is a polished inside-man. Made 23 league appearances following his transfer. Recently asked for a move, but the signs are that he has settled his differences.

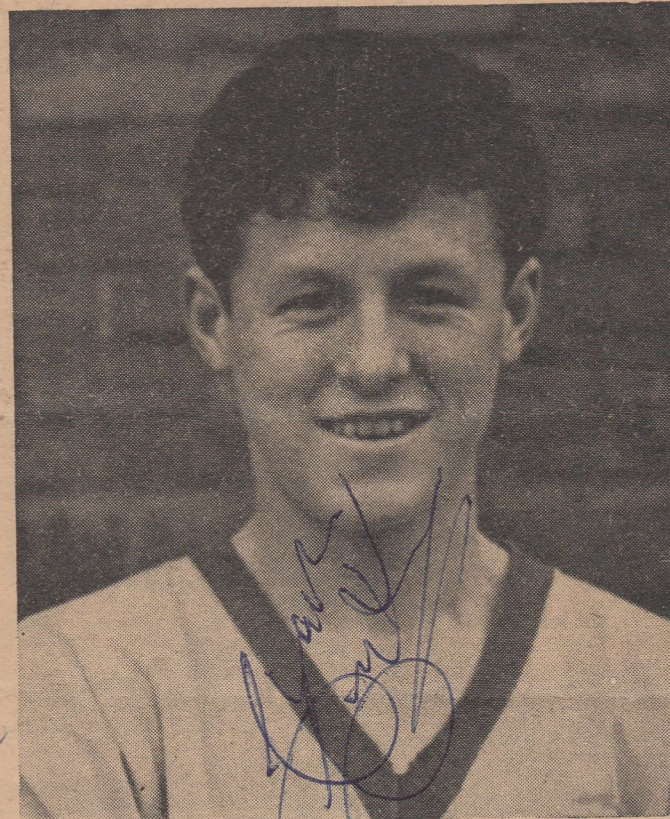
